Napa County Landmarks 2023-2024 Preservation Scholarship Application

Napa County Landmarks is dedicated to nurturing an understanding and appreciation of our local history and architectural heritage among the next generation. As part of our 2024 scholarship program, we invite eligible students to participate by submitting their applications according to the following guidelines:

Application Deadline: Submissions must be received by March 15, 2024.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Applicants must be residents of Napa County.
- Enrollment is required in a Napa County High School or as a Napa Valley College student transitioning to a four-year state or university program.

Application Requirements:

- Define a “Landmark.” For these purposes, a landmark is defined as a building, structure, or landscape that holds significance to you and the community. This includes built structures (like buildings, bridges), neighborhoods, parks, gardens, or other notable sites in Napa County that are at least 30 years old.
- **Submission Content:** The submission should explore the landmark's value to community identity, the importance of preservation, and a plan to save the landmark if it was threatened with demolition.
- **Submission Format:** Candidates may choose to present their insights in either of two formats:
 - A written essay, approximately 500 words.
 - A video presentation, approximately 5 minutes long.

Through these submissions, we seek to encourage a deeper understanding and connection with Napa’s historical landmarks. This scholarship program is an opportunity for students to articulate their perspective on our county’s heritage and its role in shaping our community.

We look forward to diverse and insightful submissions from our talented young historians and preservation enthusiasts. Let's join hands in celebrating and preserving the unique legacy of Napa County.
