[Churchill Manor](#), 485 Brown St. Built 1889 by Luther Turton for Edward S. Churchill, Sr., and family. *Vintage Blends* playing holiday music on the columned veranda from noon to 4 pm.




[The George](#), 492 Randolph St. Built 1891 by John Marquis for George and Florence Goodman as a wedding present from his parents. Free cookies in the parlor kitchen.

[Blackbird Inn & Finch Guest House](#), 1755 1st St. Craftsman-style bungalow built in 1902 for the Norton Family; Eastlake Victorian House dating to the 1890s is now a guest house. Cookies and hot apple cider will be served in the gazebo.



- ❖ **Landmarks Headquarters, 1416 Brown St.**
Pick up your wristband here. Street parking.
- ❖ The route is flat and walkable (about 2.5 miles total or 6000 steps if you're counting!). There is street parking at each site or public parking at lots marked with **P**
- ❖ Restrooms are available at Churchill Manor, The George, First Presbyterian Church, and the Napa County Library
- ❖ All four historic sites listed with a red pin are accessible via ramps or a lift.

2. [Brick & Mantel](#). Enjoy fine furniture and boutique home goods in a holiday atmosphere with decorated trees (at the historic Tockey Building, built in 1897). Surprise gift for tour guests. *1333 Main Street*
3. [Vintner's Collective Napa Valley](#) (in the 1875 stone Pfeiffer Building), is offering two-for-one wine tastings. *1245 Main Street*
4. [Ristorante Allegria](#) (located in the 1916 First National Bank) is offering a free order of calamari with your savory Italian meal. *1026 1st Street*
5. [Napa County Public Library](#) (designed by Beland, Cianelli & Associates, 1974). Pop in to check out the creations submitted to our *Landmarks Gingerbread Contest*. *580 Coombs Street*
6. [The Ackerman Family Vineyards](#) at the Ackerman Heritage House (1888, by architect Luther Turton) will be opening their outdoor patio for a splash or a glass, with an exclusive photo-op on the decorated porch of this beautifully restored mansion. *608 Randolph Street*
7. [Migliavacca Wine Company](#). Get a chance to step onto the porch for a holiday photo-op at the historic Migliavacca Mansion (designed by William H. Corlett ca. 1890). *1475 4th Street*
8. [Gentleman Farmer Wines](#). Free chef-made dog treats (eat here with your pet or to go!) plus a chance to check out this adorable restored Craftsman-style bungalow. *1564 1st Street*
9. [Wunder Boutique + Salon](#). Photo-op with a holiday backdrop and 10% off store items. Free treat for tour guests. *1317 1st Street*
10. [Makers Market](#). Free sample of Hot Buttered Rum from Yes Cocktail Co., with brown sugar, molasses, vanilla, and spices. Handmade in Paso Robles, CA. *1300 1st Street, Suite 301*
11. The [Napa County Historical Society](#) (in the 1901 Goodman Library, by Luther Turton) will be serving treats to tour goers and giving away free packets of four postcards featuring historic homes. Check out their free exhibit “The Valley Beautiful: Art” focusing on Napa’s landscape and heritage. *1219 1st Street*
